- Picture: 3 photos of replacement heifer with exhibitor,
- Copy of Department of Ag Seasonal Pass
- Entry fees.
- Certified veterinary pregnancy report. (if not brought, animal must be brought on 1/14/17 to offsite location for pregnancy check.

DAIRY CATTLE EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

1. All animals must be kept in livestock area.
2. Sign in time will be posted at dairy office.
3. Animals in Division 3100 are eligible to sell at Auction
4. Maricopa County Fair Dress Code required. Refer to Livestock Rules **NOTE: in addition, 4H and Open Youth MUST wear white pants.**
5. Registered animals must be in the exhibitor’s name by entry deadline.
6. Bring proper documentation to receiving. Seasonal pass is required for all dairy animals exhibiting at the Fair.

7. The Dairy Cattle veterinarian reserves the right to require re-tests after entries are on the grounds, or to order removal from the grounds of any animal(s) not meeting the health requirements or showing signs of illness.
8. *The Show Ring Code of Ethics* will be followed while at the fair, including conduct in and around the ring and barns before and after the classes have shown. Violations of any kind of the following items will result in forfeiture of all prizes and awards and other disciplinary action by fair management, state and national breed associations. Unethical and unacceptable practices or procedures include:
 - a. Any alteration of appearance, physical change by removal or injection is strictly prohibited.
 - b. Misrepresenting the age and/or the milking status of an animal.
 - c. Unnatural udder balancing.
 - d. Setting the teats (mechanical or chemical preparation).
 - e. Treating any part of the body (internally or externally) with any substance or method to mask deformities, weaknesses, or produce unnatural animation.
 - f. Unnatural surgery performed to change the natural appearance.
 - g. Insertion of foreign material.
 - h. Changing the color of hair at any point, spot or area.
 - i. Use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or given as a drench.
 - j. Administration of a drug which affects circulatory, respiratory or central nervous system of an animal, except for treating a recognized disease or injury.
 - k. Criticizing or interfering with the judge, show management or other exhibitors while in the show ring or any other conduct detrimental to the show will also result in award forfeiture.

DIVISION 3100: MCF Replacement Heifer Program

Exhibitor responsibilities:

1. Purchase by January 11, 2017, a Registered or Quality Grade Holstein/Jersey heifer.
2. Heifer must be no less than 630 days old and no more than 810 days old at calving ****New****
3. Heifer must be between 104 and 164 days carrying calf on January 14, 2017 (Preg Check Day)
4. Heifer must be between 191 and 251 days carrying calf on April 11, 2017 (Check in Day)
5. If needed, animal may be brought to the offsite facility, on January 14th, 2017 from 9 am - 11am, where a certified vet will check the heifer for pregnancy.
6. Animal must be halter broke at preg check and be able to load in chute for pregnancy check, this is for the safety of the animal and veterinarian.
7. Animal will then be checked for pregnancy again on the receiving date of April 11th, 2017. Any costs associated with preg checking the animal will be the exhibitor's responsibility.
8. Submit entry for proposed animal to be sold at the 2017 Maricopa County Fair, by the January 11th deadline. Entry must include three colored pictures of project: 1 front view -1 right side - 1 left side. All photos must also include exhibitor.
9. Animals will be sold by the head.
10. Exhibitor is responsible for providing proper care and nutrition for the animal. If animal is not in good dairy condition, it will NOT be allowed to show or sell in the auction. Exhibitor is encouraged to contact a local Maricopa County dairyman for "tips" on appropriate care and maintenance of project.
11. To prepare heifer for dairy life - the animal should be raised with other cattle. (heifers or cows)

DIVISION 3120: Dairy Fitting and Showmanship - \$2 Entry

Must be entered at time of Entry or there will be an Onsite Entry fee of Double the entry fee after the deadline.

Official Dress Required. Nose tongs will not be permitted due to public animal welfare concerns. This applies to all animals being fitted at the fair.
